The Central Virginia Master Gardeners are looking for people who enjoy gardening and want to learn more, who want to share their skills and help the community. Horticultural professionals conduct two 3-hour sessions per week at the VCE Louisa County Extension Office, Meeting Room second floor, 1 Woolfolk Ave. Louisa, VA. or on field trips at offsite locations.

The course provides a total of 50 hours of instruction comprised of classroom lectures, hands-on demonstrations, and field trips to local botanical gardens and commercial nurseries. Topics include:
